RAISE THE ROOF

Raising money to replace the Paradise Art Center roof


As a result of our intense rainstorms this year, the Paradise Art Center roof is not only leaking, it also caused the collapse of one of the ceiling panels in our classroom. After inspection by our contractor and roofer, we are not only having to replace our entire roof, there will need to be major construction requiring all new framing and correction of prior roofing mistakes. We are not sure of the extent of termite damage and/ or dry rot. Additionally, it is quite likely that we will have to retain the services of an engineering firm to do an assessment of the building's load-bearing infrastructure as it is suspected that a very necessary wall or structural pillars have been removed. The first phase of this project will be a minimum of \$60,000 and we suspect from conversations with the contractor that, with the new issues that will be revealed when they can see inside the roof, it will end up to be \$80,00 to \$100,000

We are looking at all the ways to raise the money needed for this crucial construction, including a bank loan, grant opportunities, community fundraising events and donor solicitation. We know that our members, community supporters and social media followers who can help monetarily will do so.



Last Fall we created Partners in Art as our overarching fundraising slogan. "Partners in Art Raise the Roof" is the name of this current campaign. Our Raise the Roof fundraising goal is \$100,000. We are off to a great start with

an anonymous offer to match funds up to \$25,000 to preserve our building, which is one of the last historic buildings in Paradise.

Nerds Plus One Reception and Show a Huge Success

The Paradise Art Center held a very unique gallery opening and reception inside Wheeler Gallery February 24. Having receptions is not new to the Art Center but this was a first of its kind special invitational show titled (Professional) Art Nerds (Plus One) featuring the works of teachers and members Steve Ferchaud, Berta Roebuck, Patti Lloyd, Sheri Schwartzeller, Emily Wycoff and Greg Sanchez (the Plus One). It was also the first of its kind reception post Camp Fire.

Over 125 people attended Saturday afternoon into the evening and the overwhelming feedback is that it was a special night of gathering and quality work that many had not seen in the new and improved Wheeler Gallery in some time. Charcuterie, prepared by Berta Roebuck.Libations served by Margaret Vanlaan-Martin also added to a great ambience as visitors crowded the gallery, hung out in the courtyard and viewed the mural by Steve Ferchaud. Doreen Fogle and President Kathy Dysert did the honors at the sales desk and were very busy. Over



30 pieces of artwork sold for a little over \$4300 as well as two silent auction paintings for \$230. In addition to raising those funds for the restructuring and reroofing of the Art Center building, attendees also generously donated an astounding \$2800 to the cause. As well, the Art Center garnered eight new members Saturday.



Greg Sanchez, the leader of The Nerds (and who professes not to be one), was ecstatic with the evening. "I was certain it would be well attended, but you never know how people will respond," he said. "The bottom line is I knew we had some of our very best and their true talent was on display."

"The group of us want to thank everyone who attended," continued Greg. "Your camaraderie, generosity and praise for what we do is why we do it. And I want to thank Steve, Berta, Emily, Sheri and Patti for making me look good."

The next special reception will be held April 20, 2024 for the Community Youth Show, featuring student work from Paradise and Ridgeview High Schools. More information will be available soon.




DONOR SPOTLIGHT - Harriet

Why Are Handmade Cups so Expensive?

People often wonder why a coffee cup in a galley or craft store costs more than one at Marshal's or Penny's. The handmade cup is created from start to finish by a person who is putting time and effort into making something that is lasting, strong, beautiful, and unique. Often it is difficult to pick a mug from all the interesting ones on display, each one has its own qualities that set it apart from the others. The small marks and variations in a handmade cup make it special. When you use that cup you may even think of the potter you talked to at the fair.

It takes a person many years to develop skill and expertise in any field, that also goes into the price, along with the material costs. You are also supporting someone who is local and often they live in your community. Your purchase helps support their lifestyle and contributes to the local economy. The mass produced cups in stores have no differences, are made in molds and by machines, often in far away countries.

All the handmade mugs I have I cherish and using them reminds of the person who made it. The purchase you make is vey important to the potter and much more direct than buying one from a large chain. Support your local artists, you will be happy you did.



Member Spotlight – Greg Sanchez

If you are familiar with the old maxim "If you want something done, give it to a busy person" it might bring to mind Paradise Art Center member Greg Sanchez. He has lived on and off in Paradise since



1973, having graduated from Paradise High School in 1977. Although not living in Paradise at the time of the Camp Fire, Greg was personally affected due to friends and family who were impacted by the disaster. He returned to make Paradise his home with the desire to help in the rebuilding of the town. He saw a need for action, and after meeting art center members Berta Roebuck and Kathleen Dysert he saw an opportunity to put both his teaching and organizational skills to use. He became a member of Paradise Art Center in 2022 and since joining he has participated as an instructor, and by working on Wheeler Gallery improvements, assisting with fundraising, and recently assuming the position of chairperson of the Facilities Committee.

Artistically Greg considers himself a 'realist' and his favorite artists are from the Italian Renaissance. He feels the greatest true artist of all is Michelangelo. It isn't only the incredible artwork produced by Michelangelo, but also his indomitable dedication to his craft.

Having seen much of Michelangelo's work in person, Greg states, "nothing prepares you for actually seeing it for real." Other artists that he admires are both Vincent Van Gogh and American realist Edward Hopper.

As an artist Greg's primary media are graphite and watercolor. He teaches drawing classes at Paradise Art Center and brings a strong personal belief "that everyone can draw and therefore everyone can be an artist with practice of basic fundamentals." His personal philosophy accepts that there are varying degrees of innate talent, but that everyone can learn and apply the sound basics of drawing.






His artistic journey began in middle school in San Jose when he became aware that he not only enjoyed drawing but had the ability to draw well. When he returned to Paradise, he found Paradise High School had a very good art department and attended every art class possible. An 'eclectic and formally trained' Paradise High School art teacher, Lynn Mills became his first mentor. The year Greg graduated he received the Outstanding Art Student award. During high school he won several

additional awards as well as several awards at the Silver Dollar Fair in Chico.

After high school he attended San Jose State for one year and then transferred to Chico State with an art major. During this time, he feels fortunate to have had mentors such as Sal Casa, Janet Turner, Tom Griffith (Sanchez had two drawings published in Griffith's book), Ken Morrow and Richard Hornaday. After graduation, Greg received his teaching credential from Chico State and began student teaching at Oroville High School under the guidance of Dave Tamori, a hall of fame teacher and coach. Dave Tamori taught his students using Drawing on the Right Side of the Brain which became Greg's teaching model.


Greg's membership brings both his formal art education with teaching and coaching experience of 32 years, as well as his dynamic 'can do' philosophy. When asked about the importance of art Greg noted "The role of art is profoundly important to mankind" and "Art history IS world history." Commenting on the importance of art locally he said, "Paradise has an astounding amount of art talent per capita, considering the fire and reduction of population. Art is a healer and many in town are using it as



such. The Art Center has a strong membership driven by an awesome President, teaching staff, board members and practicing professional, talented artists such as Steve Ferchaud, Berta Roebuck, Joanne Graham, Kathy Presentati, Cathryn Hudin, Christine McShane and Jim Robertson, just to name a few."
