

Recycling Income by Month: CRV Aluminum cans and Plastic Bottles



Thank you to everyone who continues to bring in their recycling to the Paradise Art Center. The Recycling income goes up and down some but we continue to receive close to \$90 a month with your help. The income from recycling is going into the Building Fund to help fund improvements at the Art Center.

If you haven't been bringing in your recyclable bottles and cans please feel free to drop them off in the courtyard. There are 2 plastic garbage cans with lids: one for aluminum cans and one for plastic bottles. If you have a large bag of recycling you can drop it off next to the cans. Please do not bring in glass bottles - They are heavy and do not generate enough income to offset the effort.

Member Spotlight – Cathy Hales

An organization such as Paradise Art Center depends on the continuity of support from its members as well as the surrounding community, especially after a disaster such as the 2018 Camp Fire. Such a steadfast member is Cathy Hales. Cathy has been a member of the Art Center for 19 years. She currently facilitates the Tuesday afternoon watercolor open studio and, in the past, taught a class in alcohol inks. Previously she served on the Board 3 different times, was building facilitator, helped with the Art Center fund raiser Souper Saturday and continues to help with Johnny Appleseed Days and the Chocolate Festival.

The 2018 Camp Fire brought many changes to not only the infrastructure of the Town of Paradise, but to the residents of both Paradise and Magalia. Although Cathy's home in Magalia survived the fire, when asked how the fire had impacted her life she stated, "At first I didn't realize how much I would be impacted by the fire. As time has gone by I have felt saddened for all the business that we have lost, how empty the town is, friends who lost their homes and moved away and the loss to all the trees that made Paradise Paradise." Continuing, Cathy stated, "The art center didn't open right away and we lost a whole lot of members. The group that I was in went from 10 to 3 people. The center has struggled for the past 8 years trying to add new members and improve the building. This [is] a slow process but thanks to many volunteers we are gaining more members and money for the center."



In her early years Cathy was encouraged by her mother and grandmother to engage in art projects. When older she was able to take art classes in the 8th and 9th grade, which led to her love of



watercolor. While attending college to become a teacher Cathy took classes emphasizing art for children, but retirement enabled her to follow her personal art journey. She began taking watercolor classes at Paradise Art Center with instructors Flo Barnett, Evonne Cramer and continued with Sylvia Sisley-Smejkal, Kathleen Presentati and Lenn Goldmann. She also attended classes taught by National Watercolor Society artists Valerie Payne, Lien Quen Zhen, Tony Couch, Robbie Laird and Joyce Hicks. Continuing to broaden her skills she also took classes from Christie Beebe in drawing and Vera Rodgers in colored pencil.

Having experimented with colored pencil, alcohol inks and drawing, watercolor remains Cathy's favorite medium. "I paint because I love it. It is calming. When I paint I don't think of other things, especially what is happening in the world today. I get totally engrossed with the process..." She commented that she doesn't have a favorite subject, and looking at her artwork it is obvious she is inspired by a broad variety of subjects.

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
Member Spotlight: Cathy Hales

Three of her favorite artists include Van Gogh, Monet and Michelangelo. "I like realism and impressionism. I don't understand abstract art, but once in a while I will like something abstract that I see. It's mostly the colors that I'm drawn to."

It is obvious that Cathy is a strong supporter of the Paradise Art Center and community art centers in general. "Art centers are very important to communities. They give citizens a place to gather and participate in activities they enjoy. Also they are places to meet other people with the same interest and a place to practice their art." She also stressed the importance of art in school. "Children need to experiment to see what they enjoy from art or crafts. Elementary is the best time to begin this."

Art has woven a tapestry of accomplishment throughout Cathy Hales' life and her constant and continued support of the Art Center and its membership is invaluable. If you haven't visited the Art Center recently, drop by on a Tuesday afternoon. You might be able to see one of the Wheeler Gallery exhibitions and the watercolor open studio which Cathy facilitates.

In this class we will investigate the process of making repeatable forms and surface decoration with templating. We will practice various ways of handle clay and discuss the pros/cons of each process. We will practice forms such as mugs, bowls, trays/platters/plates with a foot ring. We will create a template together, use slump molds and learn about tools, materials and ways to troubleshoot creating wares in clay.

FACILITIES UPDATES

Leaky roof in the Pottery Classroom fixed - The leaking roof in the Pottery Classroom has been fixed – the contractor team went on the roof and sprayed water on the leaky section and determined that when the wind was driving the rain from a specific direction water came straight in. The roofer re-roofed that section of the roof. While they were here working they also removed the vent pipe that was no longer in use.

Drywall patches where drywall had to be removed to resolve the leaky roof have been installed, taped and mudded. The other hole in the drywall from the vent that went through the roof has also been fixed.

Mini-Splits have been installed in the pottery classroom and in the glazing room (they will provide heating and cooling for both of those rooms. This will resolve the overall issue we were having for the entire building. Our HVAC unit was not strong enough to cool/heat the entire space – in addition to that we were using the zoning system in a way it is not designed to be used. The HVAC system on the pottery side was abandoned and the thermostat control for the HVAC was removed from the pottery classroom. There are remote controls on the pottery classroom and in the glazing room to control the mini splits.

Japanese Maple planted in the ground moved: Thank you to Sandy Miller for volunteering to move the Japanese Maple that is planted in the ground in the courtyard. It needed to be moved since the outdoor unit for the mini-splits was installed outside the window. Sandy showed up and moved the tree to a pot where it was safe for a few weeks and once the mini-split installed was complete she came back and replanted the tree – which shows NO sign of stress from the move. Sandy your help and expertise is appreciated!

Ceiling, walls, trim and interior doors painted in the pottery classroom - Since we needed to repaint the ceiling in the pottery classroom – the board made a decision to paint the ceiling, walls, trim and the interior doors in the pottery classroom. We are still investigation options for the cement floor in that room.

The light that was taken down will be re-installed soon.

Mud Room and glazing room – no work has been done in the mud room (the middle room with the sinks) or glazing room yet – but these rooms would benefit from some changes. Fundraising efforts are underway to raise money for continued improvements to the pottery side of the building.

Thanks to Patti Lloyd and Sheri Schwarzweller for their help with weeding. Your time and hard work is appreciated. We still have some weeds in the courtyard and weeds in the alley if any members have time and want to help remove them.

Sally Armstrong and Byron Wheeler have taken on the task of watering the plants in the courtyard and the lavender in the front of the building. Your initiative and time are appreciated!
